

May Festival of Our Lady: Mary, Unicorns, and Dragons

And there appeared a great wonder in heaven; a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and upon her head a crown of twelve stars: And she being with child cried, travailing in birth, and pained to be delivered. And there appeared another wonder in heaven; and behold a great **red dragon**, having seven heads and ten horns, and seven crowns upon his heads... And the serpent cast out of his mouth water as a flood after the woman, that he might cause her to be carried away of the flood. And the earth helped the woman, and the earth opened her mouth, and swallowed up the flood which the dragon cast out of his mouth.

Unicorns and **Dragons** have become wildly popular again in Western culture, as the series, *Game of Thrones*, and Starbuck's *Unicorn Frappucino* attest to. Whilst both mythical beasts have ancient antecedents, they came to be allegorically associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Incarnation of Our Lord. The Woman of the Apocalyse, threatened by the red dragon, was very early on identified with Mary, who was also regarded as a type of the Church. The **Mystic Hunt of the Unicorn** came to be understood as an allegory of the Annunciation,

hence the depiction of the Archangel Gabriel with hunting horn and hounds, pursuing the unicorn (Christ) into the lap (womb) of the Blessed Virgin.
