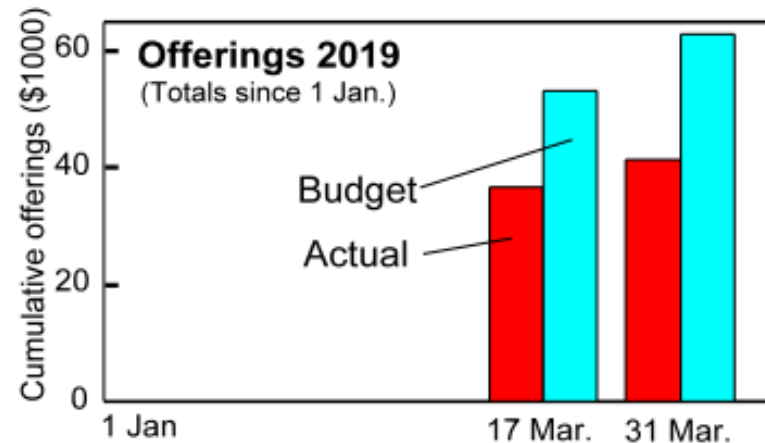

Financial Update

21 April 2019

The Parish's Annual Vestry meeting in February sent out a strong message that we need to increase our regular offerings by about 22% in order to balance our budget. Many have responded to our ongoing campaign to increase Sunday and PAR (pre-authorized remittance) offerings. Thank you!



As of 31 March, our offerings are still below budget (see the graph above). There is however some very good news! More than 1/3 of our families on PAR have increased their monthly offering. Other families have gone on PAR for the first time. Monthly totals are increasing. While we are behind where we were last year at week 13, this winter was difficult and Easter is a little later. For those of you who have yet to assess your financial commitment to your Church and its many ministries, now is the time to do that as Easter approaches.
