## **Passiontide**

---

*Passion Sunday* marks the beginning of the two-week period before Easter known as 'Passiontide'. This mini-season within Lent was eliminated from the Roman calendar with the liturgical reforms of the 1960's, however it survives to some extent within Anglicanism. The season demarcates the final year, and final week of Jesus' life on earth, respectively. As Holy Week approaches, worship becomes more austere, with the removal of the Gloria Patri from the minor propers and offices, to signify the ignominy of Christ's Passion, when He laid aside His glory. The veiling of crosses and statuary for Passion Sunday is connected to the Gospel reading originally appointed for the day, John 8:46-59, which ends with "Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple."
