





PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS

Please stand.

Celebrant: Pray, brothers and sisters, that this, our sacrifice, will be acceptable unto God the Father almighty.

All: May the Lord receive this sacrifice at your hands, to the praise and glory of His Name, both to our benefit and to that of all His Holy Church.

Celebrant: The Lord be with you;

All: And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts;
All: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God;

All: It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, Creator and Preserver of all things. But chiefly are we bound to praise Thee for the glorious Resurrection of Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord: for He is the very Paschal Lamb, which was offered for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; who by His death hath destroyed death, and by His rising to life again hath restored to us everlasting life.

Therefore, with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; evermore praising thee and saying:

Please kneel as the bells ring.

Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts, Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High. Blessed

is he that cometh in the Name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, ★ he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me. ★

As the Body of Christ is lifted you may make the sign of the cross and say in your heart, "My Lord and My God!"

Likewise, after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, ★ he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me." ★

As the chalice containing the Blood of Christ is lifted up, you may make the sign of the cross and say in your heart, "My Lord and My God!"

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded.

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion; and we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord,

by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **Amen.**
