
### May Festival of Our Lady

The month of May has traditionally been a time of popular piety and devotion honouring the Blessed Virgin Mary, the "Queen of May". This custom is believed to have arisen in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, flourished in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, and was given official recognition by Rome in the papal encyclical, mense maio, in 1965. Prior to the Reformation, England had a particularly strong devotion to the Blessed Virgin, as the Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Arundel noted: "We English, being... her own dowry, as we are commonly called, ought to surpass others in the fervour of our praises and devotions." The Wilton Diptych, pictured at right, depicting Richard II paying homage to the Virgin, was created around the time Arundel was Archbishop and is a rare example of what mediaeval English Marian piety.



# **Financial Update: Post-Easter** 5 May 2019

The Easter offerings have significantly closed our financial gap between budgeted and actual offerings: it is down from \$21,534 in March to \$9,379 as of 21 April (including all Easter offerings). We even surpassed last year's offerings for Week 16 of the year by \$5,039. That is indeed good news, and we thank you for your generosity!



Our monthly PAR offerings, which provide much-needed financial stability for our Church, also rose from \$5,350 to \$7,045 per month in April. Another six PAR applications will be processed for May. Thank you to all who answered the call these past several weeks to increase Sunday and PAR offerings.
