May Crowning

Bring flow'rs of the fairest, Bring flow'rs of the rarest, from garden and woodland and hillside and vale. O Mary we crown thee with blossoms today! Queen of the Angels and Queen of the May.

As May is the month of new life, when nature comes into full bloom, so it is that we honour the Virgin Mary, who gave new life to the world when she bore our Saviour, Jesus Christ. It is fitting then, that we should honour Mary, Mother of the Church, this Mother's Day, by crowning her with the beauty of new life, as she herself brought forth humanity's New Life. In Mary, biology and theology meet; her motherhood is theologically significant as the ultimate personal concretization of the Church. She is the Church *in person* and *as a person*. St. Augustine writes, "she is the [spiritual] Mother of the members of Christ, since by her loving devotion she cooperated in the birth of believers in the Church." Thus, following Cyril of Alexandria in his sermon on our Lady at the Council of Ephesus in 431, "... may it be granted to us to adore with deep humility the indivisible Trinity. And then let us praise with songs of joy Mary ever virgin, who herself is clearly the holy Church, together with her Son and most chaste spouse. To God be praise forever."
