

Election of a New Bishop

The Diocese of Ottawa will hold an electoral Synod to elect a new Diocesan Bishop **next Saturday March 14**.

Everyone is encouraged to pray for the upcoming election.

The following is a prayer from the Book of Common Prayer that might be used.

11. During the Vacancy of a See.

ALMIGHTY God, the giver of all good gifts: Grant thy blessing, we humbly beseech thee, to the clergy and laity about to assemble for the election of a Bishop; and give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, that a chief Pastor may be chosen who shall minister before thee to the glory of thy Name, the good government of the flock committed to his charge, and the welfare of thy holy Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Covid 19: Advice from the Diocese

In response to the novel coronavirus, the Diocese this week released guidelines to address questions and concerns about the virus. Key points include:

- We are all encouraged to wash our hands regularly and thoroughly with soap and water, and to use hand sanitizers
- Those who are ill should not attend church
- Hand to hand contact is discouraged for greeting, and for the exchange of the peace. We can acknowledge one another by bowing, for example.
- Communion in one kind is full communion receiving the bread only is an option if one does not want to receive wine from the chalice
- We are encouraged to speak openly about our fears and prejudices regarding the virus.
