

Candles and Flowers In Memoriam

In what has become a rather (in)famous letter to his parish priest lamenting the loss of ceremonious language in the new liturgy, W.H. Auden noted that, "one of the great functions of the liturgy is to keep us in touch with the past and the dead." The burial office of the American Prayerbook even goes so far as to suggest that we are, "encouraged by their examples, aided by their prayers, and strengthened by their fellowship..." So it is that when flowers and candles are given in memory of our beloved dead in Christ, we are not merely remembering them, but in fact, joining with them, "who rejoice with us, but upon another shore, and in a greater light, that multitude which no man can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom in the Lord Jesus we are for ever one," as that felicitous phrase so eloquently reminds us in the opening prayer of the service of Lessons and Carols.

Regrettably, omissions, and errors in dates occur in the bulletin from time to time, and although we love and serve a God who exists outside of time, He has nevertheless sanctified it, not only in creating the universe and setting it in motion, but by entering into time and space in the person of His Son. Dates and time therefore matter to the Creator of the Universe, even as they matter to us, who remember the passing of loved ones in hope of the resurrection. The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is "not the God of the dead, but of the living," and so it is important that the faithful departed are remembered and honoured in the bulletin and memorials.

General Synod

The 42nd General Synod of the Anglican Church of Canada will be held from July 10-16, 2019, in Vancouver, BC in the Diocese of New Westminster.

This is an important synod, as a new Primate will be selected, changes to the Marriage Canon will be voted on for a second consecutive synod, and the relationship of the ACoC with Indigenous Peoples will be discussed.
