



# **Financial Report - September 2019**

This is a brief update on the financial situation of our Parish. A more detailed report is posted in the narthex.

## As of 31 August 2019:

The graph shows the cumulative total of our offerings this year (red line) and compares it with our budget (black) and the equivalent last year (blue). The good news is that our givings continue to be substantially higher than last year. However, we have lost ground in August, and our offerings are now falling further behind budget.



# Our treasurer predicts that if this trend continues we shall end the year with a deficit of around \$15 000.

Offerings are traditionally lower in the summer, so we expect the situation to improve during the fall. However, we ask you to continue to keep the financial situation of your parish in mind.
